India Pavilion, showcasing close to 500 start-ups and has given the start-ups a great platform to engage with investors and their global counterparts.

















PROPERTY BUYING BY NON-UAE NATIONALS/ RESIDENTS IN THE UAE

The emergence and establishment of the UAE as a global hub for business and investment has been made possible due to the availability of a number and variety of opportunities that the country has to offer. Amongst these, the real estate sector occupies a prominent position and remains a preferred choice for foreign investors. Given the popularity of the sector within the country and outside, the laws

and legal framework governing property registrations have been structured to enhance ease of doing business. In many countries with a federal structure of governance, the subject of land and real estate is usually under the respective state/provincial governments. The UAE is no exception, as matters pertaining to registration of real properties are subject to Emirate level laws and regulations, whereby each

Emirate in the UAE has its own set of laws and regulations on the subject.

In this edition of India Matters, the laws applicable in respect of property registrations in the Emirate of Dubai have been put on focus, with a view to elucidate on how foreign and non-UAE resident individuals can buy properties in the Emirate of Dubai.

THE APPLICABLE LAWS:

THE LAW OF PROPERTY REGISTRATION IN THE EMIRATE OF DUBAI:

In the Emirate of Dubai, the applicable legislation in respect of property registrations is the Law No. 7 of 2006 concerning Real Property Registration in the Emirate of Dubai, as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as the 'Dubai Property Registration Law' for brevity).

PROPERTY BUYING BY NON-UAE NATIONALS:

Following the provisions of the Dubai Property Registration Law, a non-UAE national may purchase and register title over properties in the emirate of Dubai. Pursuant to Article 4 of the Dubai Property Registration Law, although the right to Real Property in Dubai is restricted to UAE nationals, nationals of the Gulf Cooperation Council States, the companies fully owned by the persons of such nationalities and public joint stock companies, some exceptions have also been made for non-UAE nationals to have (i) freehold ownership of real property; and (ii) usufruct rights (right to build) or lease rights in real property for 99 years subject to Resolutions

that may be passed by His Highness the Ruler of Dubai.

As such, Article 4 of the Dubai Property Registration Law reads as follows:

"The right to own Real Property in the Emirate shall be restricted to UAE nationals, nationals of the Gulf Cooperation Council States, companies fully owned by these nations, and public joint stock companies. Subject to the approval of the Ruler, non-UAE nationals may be granted the following rights in the relevant areas determined by the Ruler:

- Freehold ownership of Real Property, without time restrictions; and
- Usufruct or lease rights in Real Property for up to ninety-nine (99) years."

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 4 of the Dubai Property Registration Law, as mentioned above, Resolutions have been issued by His Highness the Ruler of Dubai, from time to time, identifying and demarcating specific areas in the Emirate of Dubai, where non-UAE nationals may have –

- freehold ownership of real property; and
- usufruct rights (right to build) or lease rights in real proper-

ty for 99 years.

Following the above provisions, over the years non-UAE national investors have been able to invest in, purchase and sell real properties in the Emirate of Dubai at specific areas identified and demarcated for the purpose.

PROPERTY BUYING BY NON-RESIDENTS:

Whereas, it is now clear that by the provisions of the Dubai Property Registration Law, residents and non-resident foreigners in the UAE may invest in, buy and sell properties in the Emirate of Dubai, the subsequent question in the natural sequence is whether non-residents can also purchase real properties without being physically present in the country or more specifically, the Emirate of Dubai.

The answers to the question mentioned above is in the affirmative. As such, a non-UAE national also need not be a resident of the UAE to invest in and/or hold title on real property/ies in such freehold/ leasehold areas, and such person also need not be physically present in the country to complete the sale-purchase transactions. Essentially, this can be achieved by way of appoint-

ing a representative via a power of attorney duly notarised and legalised. The procedure to do so is summarily described as follows

• Appointing a Representative
The first step in the process is for
the non-national and non-resident individual to appoint a
representative who may act on
behalf of the prospective buyer
as his/her attorney, to buy the
desired real property and thereby complete all transactions applicable in that regard. Such representative could either be an
individual or a corporate entity.

Power of attorney

The next step in the process is the preparation of a suitable power of attorney to be issued by the buyer in favour of his representative/ attorney. Ideally, the buyer may engage a law firm in Dubai to draft a power of attorney suitable for purchasing real properties in the Emirate of Dubai. Essentially, the power of attorney should enable the attorney to sufficiently represent the buyer in all kinds of transactions pertaining to the sale/ purchase of the property and represent the buyer before all competent authorities (statutory or non-statutory) and other entities (developers, brokers etc.).

Where the property is to be purchased from a developer, the developer's advice may be sought in terms of the transactions envisaged. This shall assist in creating a suitable power of attorney.

Attestations

Once the draft of the power of attorney is finalised, the buyer is then required to execute the same and get it attested by certain competent authorities – first, at the jurisdiction where the buyer may be located and subsequently in the UAE, by the attorney. These are noted hereinafter.

OUTSIDE THE UAE

Notary Public:

Upon execution of the PoA, the first step is to get the same attested by the Notary Public (or other similar authority) in accordance with the applicable laws of the jurisdiction where the buyer may be located. Whilst in some jurisdiction, the signatures are to be made before the Notary Public, in others the Notary Public may affix his/her attestations later.

Apostille/ Attestation by the Foreign Ministry

Once the power of attorney has been suitably signed and attested by the competent Notary Public, the document must be either apostilled or attested by foreign ministry of the country where the buyer may be located.

UAE Missions

Upon due completion of attestations at the foreign ministry, the power of attorney must then be sent to the UAE Embassy/ Consulate in the country where the buyer may be located.

Once all the steps mentioned above have been duly and fully completed, the buyer may arrange to send the original power of attorney document to the attorney in the UAE, whereupon the attorney will also have to undertake a few additional attestations to complete legalisation of the PoA, and for the same to have full validity and enforceability in terms of the envisaged transactions i.e., sale-purchase of real property in the Emirate of Dubai in the UAE.

• Attestation by Notary Public in Dubai:

The person issuing the POA could get it attested by the Notary Public in Dubai through their e-services which attests the POA virtually without the need of the issuer of the POA to be physically present in the UAE.



WITHIN THE UAE

Upon receipt of the original PoA, the attorney must proceed to complete the following steps.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs, United Arab Emirates

Once the power of attorney is received by the attorney, he must first get it attested by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Co-operation in the UAE.

• Translation to Arabic

If the power of attorney is in a non-Arabic language, then it must be legally translated to Arabic by an approved legal translator, whereupon the translated document must also be stamped by the approved legal translator.

Ministry of Justice

Once the legal translation of the power of attorney is completed and the same is stamped by the translator, the power of attorney must then be taken to the Ministry of Justice, UAE for further attestation. These days, however, the procedure may be completed by applying through the web portal of the Ministry of Justice.

Upon completion of all the formalities mentioned above, the attorney may use the power of attorney (duly signed, notarised and legalised) to purchase the desired property on behalf of the buyer, and complete all the necessary transactions.

CONCLUSION:

The steps involved, the procedures to buy a property in Dubai are seamless and easy to complete.

rinking water contamination has sevunderlying issues. The problem is not straightforward enough that it can be solved using only a filter bought from the neighbourhood store or by boiling the water. The sparkling clean, filtered water served to you in a silver vessel may not be so clean after all. Food and water being contaminated with arsenic can cause cancer, and this challenge has long demand-

ed a custom solution. Here are some start-ups that are shaking things up in the fight to solving the water crisis:

'Amrit' Arsenic and Metal Removal by Indian Technology (AMRIT), an indigenous initiative by Dr.Pradeep of IIT Madras, uses nanotechnology to destroy microbes, absorb arsenic, remove metals, and downgrade pesticide content found in drinking water. AMRIT does not work on electricity and can be implemented in any community to

offer safe, clean drinking water at the most affordable cost.

'Swajal' The Ministry of Jal Shakti has launched the 'Swajal' Safe, sustainable drinking water for all. initiative as a pilot project/ demand-driven programme involving the community to provide sustainable access to safe drinking water to people in rural areas. Supported by UNICEF, the Swajal programme is empowering communities to plan, design, implement and monitor single village drinking water supply



schemes and organise community ownership for operation and maintenance. The target population for Swajal in 117 aspirational districts across 28 states is about 5,00,000 people a year.

The Programme has helped in prioritising integrated water safety planning, behaviour change and community participation and Water Quality Monitoring in most deprived aspirational districts, thereby providing 18.6 million people access to safe drinking water. The learnings from Swajal will be upscaled to NRDWP strengthening the community management aspects along with technological options. UNICEF will strengthen the ongoing support to the Ministry of Jal Shakti for community management of water supplies.


