



EXPATRIATE WILLS IN THE UAE

A 'Will' is meant to record the last wishes of a person in terms of succession over his assets, guardianship of his minor chil-

dren (if any) and any other wishes to be fulfilled, post his death. For enforceability, a Will must be signed by the person making the

same (i.e., the testator), and depending on the applicable laws, must also be registered/ attested by the competent authorities.

IMPORTANCE OF WILLS:

For any expatriate living and holding assets in a foreign country or in multiple jurisdictions, the importance of making a 'Will' cannot be undermined. When a person passes away without leaving behind a Will (i.e., dies intestate), the applicable laws of succession take effect in the due course, and the deceased person's assets are dealt with, per such applicable laws by the authorities. For example, for suc-

cession to assets of a Hindu individual dying intestate in India, the provisions of the Hindu Succession Act of 1956 shall invariably apply.

But for an expatriate dying intestate, in a foreign country, this process may get complicated due to differences in laws of succession applicable in his host country with those of his own. The heirs and successors of the deceased expatriate must then

pursue legal proceedings to formally prove their rights on the assets and properties of the deceased expatriate. The probate proceedings as such are time consuming, and most often cause financial hardships for the heirs and successors. However, a formally prepared and legally enforceable Will helps to salvage the rights and interests of the dependents and beneficiaries of a deceased person per his wishes.

THE APPLICABLE LAWS OF THE UAE:

In the UAE, the laws regarding personal matters like succession, inheritance and guardianship (inter alia) are set forth under the Federal Law No 28 of 2005 on Personal Status (the "Personal **Status Law")**, as amended from

IN MATTERS OF SUCCES-**SION AND INHERITANCE:**

- · Matters pertaining to inheritance or "heritage" are to be governed by the laws applicable of the deceased person's native state at the time of his death.
- Where an expatriate dies intestate and without any heirs his assets at the time of his death shall automatically be transferred to the State. (i.e., the UAE).

time to time. Additionally, certain provisions of the Federal Law No 5 of 1985 on the Issuance of the Civil Transactions Law (the "Civil Transactions Law") also applied to the aforesaid matters. Certain changes were introduced

 Where an expatriate had made a will, UAE laws would only apply if the same was so specified in the will of the deceased expatriate. Otherwise, the laws of his native country would be applicable.

GUARDIANSHIP, CUSTO-DY, TUTELAGE

The objective matters related to guardianship, custody, tutelage, and other objective systems to protect persons lacking capacity, are to be governed by the laws

to the Personal Status Law and the Civil Transactions Law by the Federal Decree Law No (29) of 2020 ("FDL 29/2020"). The amended position of the laws is described here in after.

of the native state of the person whose protection is required. Indian expatriates living in the UAE, shall now be subject to the personal laws of India, as far as matters of inheritance, succession and guardianship inter alia are concerned. However, to avoid unnecessary time and cost implications of probate, it is important and advisable for non-Muslim Indian expatriates living in the UAE, to register their Wills, especially if they hold assets in the country.

ing to register their Wills with a Notary Public, must prepare the same in English and Arabic (bilingual format), and subsequently execute the same before the Notary Public who shall then attest the same upon being satisfied with the contents and due process. Upon registration by the Notary Public, the Will becomes legally binding.

GUARDIANSHIP, CUSTO-DY, TUTELAGE

The Dubai International Financial Centre (DIFC) Courts of Dubai provides 'Will Services' whereby registration and probate services are available for non-Muslims in the UAE. The Wills registered at the DIFC Courts allows non-Muslim expatriates to include all of their assets wherever located in the world. The Wills may be registered solely in the English language based on the applicable laws of the DIFC (more specifically - the DIFC Wills and Probate Registry Rules). The DIFC Courts offers five types of Wills for registration, namely - full

will, guardianship will, property will, financial assets will, and business owners will. A testator intending to make provisions for all of his assets worldwide, guardianship for his/her minor children, shares in business, financial assets etc may opt for full will. Otherwise, depending on his/her requirements, a testator may opt for other kinds of Wills. Comparatively, one may find DIFC Courts Wills Services to be on the higher side in terms of costs, but looked at from a benefits perspective, the costs may be justified. For instance, a DIFC Will upon registration is kept in the DIFC Court Registry's electronic system for (at least) 120 years from the date of birth of the testator or for 10 years from the Grant, whoever is the sooner. As a result, there are lesser chances of dispute as to the authenticity of a Will and ensures an expedited Probate processing. These days, at the DIFC Courts, Wills are executed and registered virtually in the presence of the testator, the authorised official from the

Registry and two witnesses.

ADGM Courts - Notary Public and Wills Office: The Abu Dhabi Global Markets (ADGM) Courts also has its own Notary Public and Wills Office. The services provided here are limited in scope as of now inasmuch as it provides "non-Muslim Wills service for all ADGM registered entities and their employees".

Attestation Services of the Indian Missions in the UAE: Non-Muslim Indian expatriates residing in the UAE may also elect to register their Wills at the Indian Missions of the UAE i.e., the Embassy of India at Abu Dhabi and the Consulate General of India at Dubai. The services as of now are provided by IVS Global - the authorised service provider, at its centres at Dubai and Abu Dhabi.

Other Options: The FDL 29/2020 has provisions for each Emirate to have its own "Non-UAE National Will" registry. Such registries are currently under development.

POINTS TO BE NOTED:

- Common Terms: A testator is the one who makes the Will; 'executors' are the ones responsible for execution of the instructions made in the Will: and beneficiaries are the ones who are given a benefit out of the testator's estate per the Will. Estate means all of the testator's assets. 'Probate' means the official proving of a Will after the testator's demise at the court of competent jurisdiction.
- Jurisdiction: As noted above,
- there are multiple ways in which one may register his/ her Will in the UAE. However, it may be noted that all such Wills may not suffice all requirements of a testator. For instance, a 'Notary Public Will' would only cover one's UAE estate whilst the DIFC Will is meant to cover one's global estate.
- Multiple Wills: If a testator has already made a Will before, and wishes to make another Will in the UAE, he
- must look out for overlapping provisions, especially with respect to any particular asset and preferably record his reasons for making the second Will.
- Applicable Laws: Wills registered in jurisdictions (like DIFC) can cover a testator's worldwide assets. However, it is always prudent for testators to first check if the Will shall suffice for all the jurisdictions where the assets are situated.

CONCLUSION:

OFFICES OF THE NOTARY PUBLIC:

THE OPTIONS FOR REGISTRATION:

Expatriates in the UAE may approach offices of the Notary Public under the courts of competent jurisdiction in various Emirates, for registration of their Wills, under the applicable provisions of the Personal Status Law and the Civil Transactions Law, in respect of their UAE estate only. Non-Muslim expatriates intendApart from its legal implications, matters like succession and inheritance as well as guardianship of one's minor children also hold great sentimental significance for any individual. Everyone wishes for one's hardearned assets and legacy to pass on to one's loved ones in accordance with one's own personal laws. In the current legal framework, expatriates have a number of options to take care of such requirements. Most importantly, the progressive leadership of the UAE deserves admiration for having realised this requirement of the nation's substantial expatriate population and accordingly addressing the problems as necessary.





Historically, the story of Rajasthan stretches back to the dawn of human civilization. over 60 per cent of the Thar Desert. Areas of what is now Rajasthan were a part of the Indus Valley Civilization (3300 BCE - 1300 BCE). Kalibangan, in Hanumangarh district, had been a major site of the Indus Valley Civilization. Rajasthan, the region where humankind learnt to harness the power of the sun, well over a millennia ago, is today home to the world's largest solar farm. 
